Boquet Valley was awarded as a School of Distinction from the New York State Public High School Athletic Association for the 2022-23 school year. To qualify for this award, 100% of




a school's varsity teams must receive the Scholar-Athlete Team award. This means that 75% of a

3. It has been a busy month for Mountain View students with lots of amazing field


