Dear Boquet Valley Parents and Guardians,

The OASIS after school program at Lake View began on Monday, September 9th and continues through the school year. If you would like your child/children to participate, **please fill out the** <u>ACAP/OASIS registration form</u> on the Boquet Valley Central School District website. Students can also pick up a hard copy version of the registration in the main office at Lake View. This program is rolling enrollment; however, it is split into sessions and students will not be able to participate until a new session starts. Your child <u>MUST</u> have a completed ACAP/OASIS form on file before they are able to participate in afterschool, early release day, weekend, or summer programming through OASIS.

The program will run from 3:10 pm to 5:15pm on Monday through Thursday on normal school days and is free to all participants and on early release days from 12-3pm. The aims of the afterschool program are to improve academic performance, improve social emotional competencies, and help Boquet Valley students make successful transitions in school and to careers or higher education.

Each day, students will receive a snack, then participate in gamified academic enrichment, and their chosen program. We aim to provide a safe place for students to get help with their schoolwork, participate in engaging activities with their peers, and have an opportunity to try new experiences. We partnered with Cornell Cooperative Extension of Essex County, College for Every Student, Building Resilience in Essex Families, and other community organizations to provide engaging programming like nutrition education, career and college readiness, STEAM activities, social and emotional wellness activities, pottery, phonics, and so much more for our students.

Mondays: Drama

This is for grades 3-5 only.
